Organization: Surrey School District

Age: 23

Ahmed is an Integrated Child and Youth Peer Support Worker and Safe School Liaison within the Surrey School District. He connects at-risk youth with vital resources, collaborating with organizations like Surrey RCMP and Surrey Police Service. He mentors Indigenous youth through the Blue Eagles Cadet Program, focusing on culture, wellness, and leadership. Recognized as a 2024 BC Lions Community Hero and featured by the Metro Vancouver Transit Police, Ahmed's impactful work provides mentorship, conflict resolution, and emotional guidance, helping vulnerable youth build brighter futures. He is currently pursuing a law enforcement degree at the Justice Institute of BC.
